DA/ITEM 4.4 BUSH CAMPING WORKING PARTY MEETING OCTOBER 2017

1. HERITAGE SURVEYS – MINLACOWIE AND PARARA CAMPGROUND BUSH TOILETS

PURPOSE

To provide the Bush Camping Working Party information in relation to Aboriginal Heritage Survey costs for the Enviro bush toilet sites.

RECOMMENDATION

That the report be received.

LINK TO STRATEGIC PLAN

BACKGROUND

In accordance with the Indigenous Land Use Agreement (ILUA), Narrunga Nations Aboriginal Corporation (NNAC) requested that Aboriginal Heritage Surveys be undertaken on the sites of Parara and Minlacowie prior to any ground disturbance.

Blackwood Heritage Consulting on behalf of NNAC provided two (2) quotations;

1. Heritage Consultants \$10,433
2. Narungga Participants \$968

Negotiations took place with Blackwood Heritage for the Heritage Consultants work which resulted in their survey costs being reduced to \$5,071.00 - subsequently a Purchase Order was raised for \$6,039. A significant reduction in fees was agreed to due to other heritage survey work having to be undertaken at the same time.

DISCUSSION

The Heritage Report identified archaeological locations near the sites of the proposed bush toilets. The report did not advise that a Heritage Consultant and Narungga Participant would need to be on site when any ground disturbance was to take place.

Just prior to work commencing on site, Councils operations Co-ordinator Nick Hoskin received two (2) more quotes for monitoring.

1. Heritage Consultant \$4,886
2. Narungga Participants \$968

Council discussed the need for on site monitoring having regard to the findings of the Heritage Report and the costs associated with the Heritage Consultant being on site.

Whilst it was agreed for the Narungga Participant to be on site during the excavation process, the Heritage Consultant also attended.

Overall costs associated with the site assessment, Heritage Reports and monitoring of ground disturbance equated to \$11,893.

Council staff are currently investigating alternative Archaeologists to undertake Aboriginal heritage surveys.
