COMMUNITY DISCUSSION SESSION

Rex Minerals' Draft PEPR Management Plans for: Air quality, Noise, Blasting, Rainwater Tank Testing

When: 1.30 pm, Sunday 18th June

Where: Pine Point Hall

Rex Minerals is currently developing its Management Plans for the Hillside Mine as part of its Program for Environment Protection and Rehabilitation (PEPR).

Each Plan must describe how the Company intends to operate the Mine to meet the range of conditions imposed by Government when, in 2014, it granted a Mining Lease for Hillside.

Three of these Plans – on air quality (including rain water tank testing), noise and blasting – are now available in draft form for public consultation, as required by Government.

To ensure these three Plans take account of local concerns, expectations and knowledge, the HMCV Working Groups on *Air Quality*, *Noise* and *Blasting* is holding a Community Discussion Session to give local residents an opportunity to obtain information and contribute to full and open discussion on the issues.

Discussion topics for each plan will include;

- Community perspectives and expectations
- What Mining Lease conditions must be met
- Planned control measures and mitigation strategies
- Proposed monitoring program
- Keeping the community informed
- Dealing with complaints.

Information will be provided by Rex Minerals and representatives from the Mineral Resources Division (DPC), while local speakers will be invited to contribute their views. There will be ample time for questions, debate and interaction on each topic.

Why your participation in these sessions is important

When approved, the PEPR becomes a key operational document used by Government to regulate the Hillside Mine Operations. It is therefore vital that we, as a community (and especially those living in close proximity to the planned mine) take this opportunity to have input into the PEPR document's Management Plans.
