CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

SCHOOLS CATEGORY

HOW TO ENTER

FOR THE SCHOOL

1. To be eligible, schools must be located within the boundaries of the Yorke Peninsula Council.
2. Entry is FREE by a school into the school section.
3. All work must be created by the student. The entry must be conceptualized, developed, and completed by the student. If a teacher has any doubt about the originality of the piece, it should not be submitted.
4. Definition of year levels:
 - a. junior school, Reception - year 2;
 - b. primary school, years 3 - 6;
 - c. middle school, years 7 - 9; and
 - d. senior school, years 10 - 12.
5. All exhibits must clearly show on the back of the exhibit:
 - a. the name of the school;
 - b. name of the student artist;
 - c. title of artwork;
 - d. medium
 - e. if available for sale – or alternatively marked “Not for Sale (NFS)”.
6. A limit of four (4) entries will be accepted from each school in each category e.g. four (4) junior school entries, four (4) primary school entries, four (4) middle school entries and four (4) senior school entries.
 - a. an Entry Form must be filled in for each school, clearly showing that work is a school entry;
 - b. a maximum 16 works per school will be accepted.

7. As the YP Art Exhibition is biennial, we will accept artwork for all age Categories created in the previous year as long as it meets all other exhibition conditions, i.e. in this case artwork created in 2019.
 - a. this means schools now have the option of holding artwork over from the previous year (with the students permission) for any age category, for submission into the biennial (2020) Exhibition Program.
8. School entries will be displayed in a dedicated School Exhibition Space as part of the Exhibition in Ardrossan Town Hall.
9. Students may enter the Open categories (see the website to apply). All entries in the Open Exhibition are for sale.
10. Students cannot enter into both school and Open competitions with the same artwork.

SCHOOL PRIZE

11. Thanks to our generous Sponsors, a \$250 art supply voucher and perpetual trophy will be awarded to school with the most points as follows:

Points	Category
2	For every entry
10	For a winning entry
5	For a second place entry
10	For the People's Choice winning entry

12. Delivery of artwork accepted on Saturday 24 March 2020, between 9:00am and 4:00pm at the Ardrossan Town Hall.
13. Collection of artwork opens 12 noon on Monday 13 April 2020.

FOR THE STUDENT / ARTIST

1. There is no fee for students entering the school competition.
2. Each entry must be the students / your own work.
3. Any medium may be used for school section.
4. Works must be suitably presented in a 2D format. (*artwork must hang straight - not curl on hanging.*)
 - a. it preferred that the artwork is framed;
 - b. NO entry can exceed 1.5 square metres including frame.
5. Entries may be from individual students or groups of students from the same school and category.
6. The Committee reserves the right to remove any unsuitable artwork from the exhibition.

7. Student artworks may be available for sale under the same terms and conditions as the Open Competition (ie 20% commission + GST). If for sale, prices will need to be included on the Open entry form, or alternatively, marked NOT FOR SALE (NFS).

JUDGING CRITERIA

1. Creativity and Originality - there is evidence of imagination, creativity, and individuality. The result is distinctive and the concept presented in a unique way that is imaginative and inventive.
2. Technique - the student chooses and utilizes media and tools competently to enhance the appearance of the work.
3. Organization - the use of elements and the principles of art are used effectively and selectively to enhance the overall appearance of the work.
4. Clarity of Theme - the work combines technique, expression, and organization through artistic and critical judgment to achieve an effective interpretation of the theme.
5. Presentation - the presentation is in accordance with the style of the art piece and the theme of the competition.
6. The judges' decision is final – no discussion will be entered into.
7. The judges reserve the right not to award a prize in any category if, in their belief, the work is not of a worthy standard for a prize.

STUDENT PRIZES

As part of the Exhibition, a range of Prizes will be awarded to the successful student exhibitors thanks to our generous Sponsors.

- a. junior school, first prize \$75 and second prize \$25;
- b. primary school, first prize \$100 and second prize \$50;
- c. middle school, first prize \$150 and second prize \$75;
- d. senior school, first prize \$250 and second prize \$100; and
- e. People's Choice Award \$100
