Latest successful business grant applications

Ballara Art & Retreat (Warooka) - Bettong and Buddies Event - \$1,2500

The funding is to financially assist Ballara Art & Lifestyle Retreat to host the event "Bettong & Buddies" in May 2022. The event includes an ecology and native species workshop for children, a professional theatre performance by Dunnart Productions, animal engagement with native species and presentation and project update for the Marna Bangarra project. The event is targeted at families, visitors and local community

Port Vincent Oyster (Port Vincent) - Accessible oyster punt - \$5,000

The funding is to financially assist Port Vincent Oysters with the costs of customising the oyster punt to ensure it is disability accessible. These customisations will include the addition of a landing barge at the front of the boat, which will allow for mobility aids to be wheeled straight onto the punt. In addition to this, there will be side access doors which can be taken out so that there is no need to step over the side of the punt to get on or off. Handrails will be installed to ensure safe movement around the punt and anchor points will be installed to ensure wheelchairs or walkers can be secured if necessary."

Vincent the Provedore (Port Vincent) - Short-term rent assistance - \$2,500

The funding is to financially assist the short-term rent for Vincent the Provedore - an infant business opening their doors on the 31st of December 2021 after ups and downs of the COVID-19 pandemic. The funding will support the business to maintain trading over winter months.

Studio Surf Gallery (Marion Bay) - Point of Sales system and outdoor seating upgrade - \$1,300

The funding is to financially assist Studio Surf Gallery in upgrading the Point of Sale system and providing comfortable outdoor seating. There are some positive benefits for Marion Bay, which has limited resources and businesses, and for local artists through the funding.

Business Grant Opportunities

Tourism Grants for Indigenous Business - Round 2

Agency: National Indigenous Australians Agency

Aim: increase the number of Indigenous-owned tourism products available in the market

Eligible applicants: Indigenous-owned tourism businesses and Indigenous-owned community organisations

Close date: 12 July 2022 11:30 pm (ACT Local Time)

Estimated grant value: From \$1 to \$100,000

See it LIVE Grants

Agency: South Australian Department for Innovation and Skills

See it LIVE E-vouchers: 5,000 e-vouchers of \$400 each for live music and hospitality venues to host live music. The vouchers will help music acts get back into pubs, clubs, small bars, restaurants, cafes and other smaller venues.

Venue Registration Period: 19 June – 19 July 2022 via <u>an online portal</u>. No further registrations will be permitted after 19 July 2022

Activity Redemption Period: 19 July – 31 October 2022. Venues will be able to redeem their voucher during the Activity Redemption Period for eligible expenditures incurred during the Activity Redemption Period.

Music Event Grants:

- Stream A Music Event (Medium): 100 grants of \$5,000 each for medium-scale music events in regional venues and mid-tier capacity venues (e.g. with a capacity up to 1,000)
- Stream B Music Event (Large): 25 grants of \$20,000 each for larger-scale music events, including in laneways, wineries, higher capacity venues and theatres.
- Stream C Music Festival / Event (Major) 05 grants of \$50,000 each for major festivals and music events at venues like the showgrounds, parklands, arenas etc.

Open date: 19 June 2022

Assessment period: Applications are processed and assessed as they are submitted, in order of submission.

Closing date: Each stream will close for applications as soon as funding capacity for the stream is fully expended.

Venue Improvement Grants: 200 grants of \$5,000 each for upgrades to cater for live music performances. Eligible activities such as modifying layouts to allow for a small stage, create better viewing spaces for audiences, improve acoustics or upgrade sound systems.

Assessment period: Applications are processed and assessed as they are submitted, in order of submission.

Closing date: Each stream will close for applications as soon as funding capacity for the stream is fully expended.
