Request: Replacement of corroded pavers and improved access for disabled and elderly people-
Corny Point Museum

The museum (previously church) is leased from Yorke Peninsula Council by Corny Point Progress Association.

For the past 3 years this building has operated as a museum and opened to the public monthly or upon request. The number of visitors, while not large in number is nonetheless constant. Many of the visitors are elderly.

We are concerned about the deterioration to a section of pavers near the entrance and lack of rails. There are also 2 potential trip hazards, one at the entrance door and the other approaching the building.

We are requesting these matters be addressed by way of

1. replacing the corroded pavers with a graded concrete slab
2. provision of a small rubber ramp over the entrance stoop
3. installation of rails in the appropriate places, possibly between posts A&B and B&C as shown on the sketch

The building has ongoing salt damp issues which will be obvious on inspection so remedial work will have to take account of this problem.

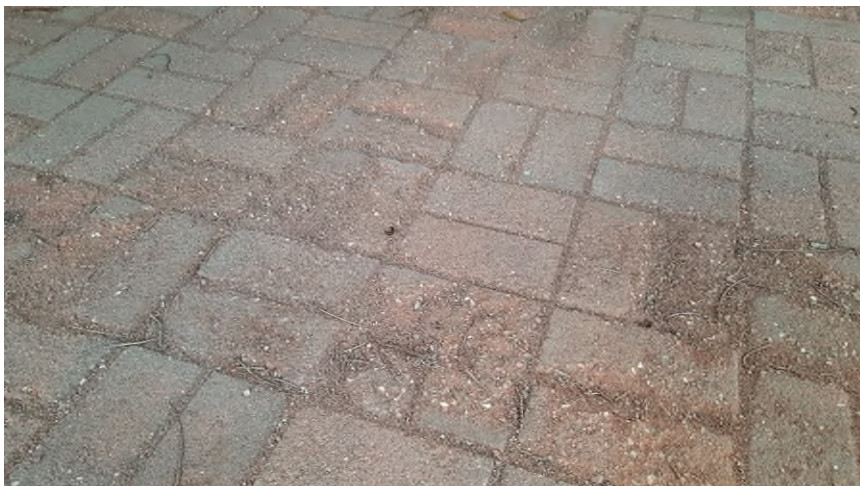

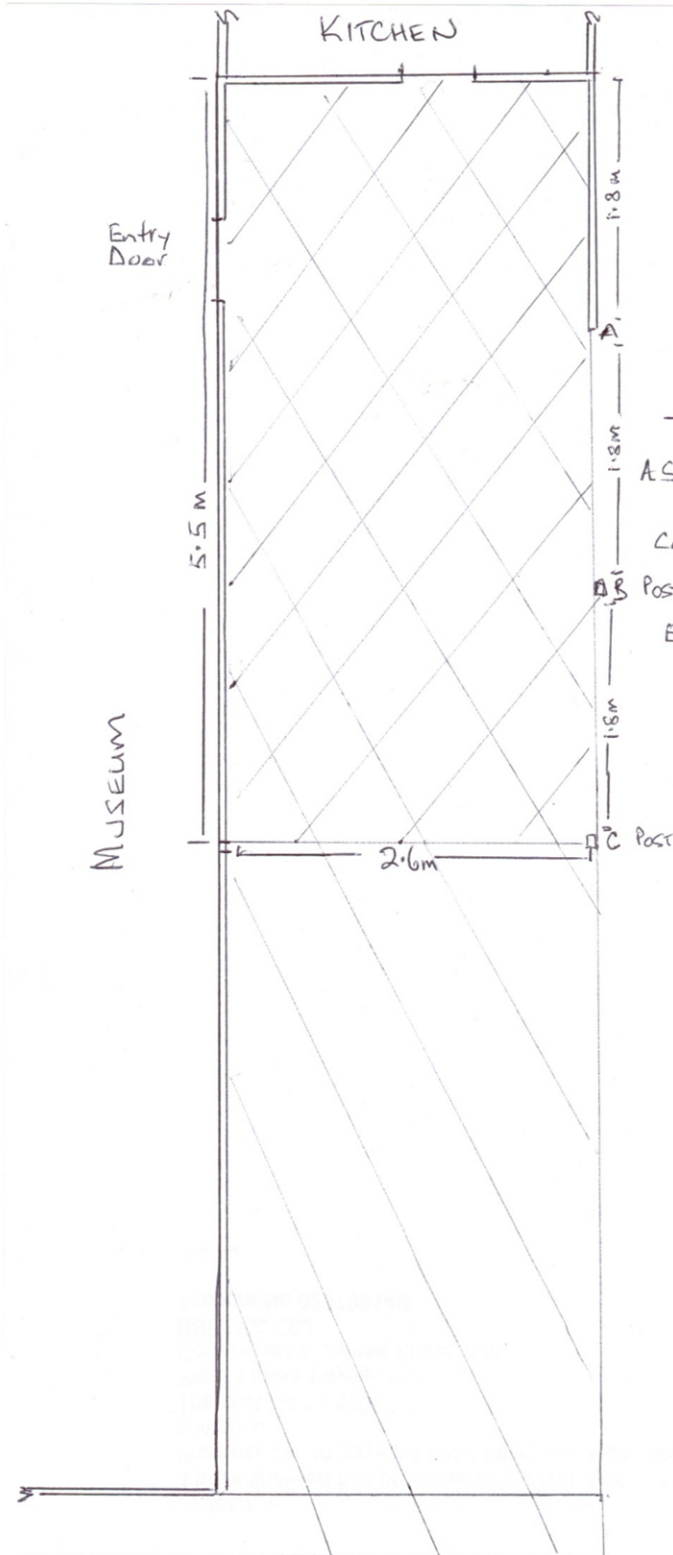
