

Bushfire of 2019

The Southern Yorke Peninsula Water Tower Mural Trail now stands as a permanent reminder of the resilience shown by the local community during the devastation of the 2019 bushfire.

On 20 November 2019, a fire sparked near the Yorketown water tower, on a catastrophic fire danger day.

By the time the fire was extinguished, 33 people had been treated for minor fire-related injuries, hundreds of animals killed or injured, 11 properties destroyed and 5000 hectares of land burnt

The Country Fire Service (CFS) volunteered to wash down each SA Water tower before painting begun; shown in the photos above and below.



PORT VINCENT

The local history of boating, fishing, beach fun and family culture can be seen in the two different scenes.

Changes in lifestyle from past to present are also depicted - from a time where Narungga people (traditionally spelt Nharangga) fished from necessity to one where a boy with his dog, fishes for fun.

STANSBURY

Depicts the notable fauna and natural landscape of Stansbury, including the Blue Swimmer Crabs, a large pelican, bottlenose dolphins, Norfolk Island Pines, oysters, ribbon-weed, and the iconic jetty and coastline.

COOBOWIE

Features distinctive bird life and flora found around Coobowie, including the Great Egret, Black Swan, Royal Spoonbill, Pelican, Cape Barren Goose, Pied Oystercatcher, pigface, Mallee Bush Pea, Coastal White-Mallee, Osborn's Eyebright and Clover Glycine.


EDITHBURGH

Showcases Edithburgh's natural beauty and striking underwater views with images of a Striped Pyjama Squid, Leafy Sea Dragon, White Bellied Sea Eagle, Far Eastern Curlew, cuttlefish and the Troubridge Lighthouse.


