Australia Day Celebration 2024

Yorke Peninsula Council held its annual Australia Day Celebration on January 26.

The event was held at the Maitland Town Hall starting with a Citizenship Ceremony followed by the presentation of the Australia Day Awards.

"Nominees for this year's Yorke Peninsula Council Australia Day Awards have been recognised for their outstanding contributions to their community," Mayor Darren Braund said.

"All the nominees should be proud of their efforts and Council thanks them for making a difference in their communities."

At the conclusion of the award presentations, a free afternoon tea was held.

Award winners

Award for Active Citizenship: Minlaton and District Community and Sports Club. Minlaton sporting clubs and supporters combined to create a new community sporting and recreational facility at the town oval. Years of fundraising and thousands of volunteer hours culminated with the opening of the clubrooms in 2023. The club has become the home base for football, cricket and hockey. It is also used by tennis and netball clubs with associated courts to be developed in the future. The project has fostered cooperation between community and sporting groups through active fundraising and working bees. The modern facility has become a source of community pride.

Community Event of the Year: Ardrossan 150th Anniversary Celebrations Organising Committee. Ardrossan celebrated 150

years since the township's proclamation in October last year. A volunteer committee organised a weekend of celebrations for the whole community to enjoy. Celebrations began with a gala dinner attended by 170 people and family movie night attended by about 100 people. A street parade and town fair attracted an estimated 2000 people. A concert was also held at the Ardrossan Town Oval. The weekend-long event concluded with an ecumenical church service, morning tea with floral display and a family picnic on the clifftop.

Young Citizen of the Year: Molly Flanagan. In her short time living on Yorke Peninsula, Molly has contributed in many ways to St Columba's Memorial School, wider community and as a creative arts therapist based part time at the SYP Community Centre.

Molly's most recent project was to facilitate a program called The Lullaby Project. She gathered and inspired local musicians to work with parents and carers of preschoolers to write songs about their life on Yorke Peninsula. People from all over the peninsula were involved to create more than 20 lullabies, inspiring families who before didn't feel they could be creative while also providing local artists a rare opportunity to collaborate. This culminated in a concert with over 100 in attendance.

Citizen of the Year: Ben Wundersitz. Ben was the founding member of a rural men's health organisation he named Fat Farmers. Ben's passion for rural health has given rise to the Fat Farmers rural health initiative that has been adopted across large areas of regional SA and has now crept over the border into Victoria.





Wool Bay Mural best rural art in Australia

Wool Bay Water Tank Mural has been recognised as Australia's best rural art experience.

The tank and shed murals, a project of Yorke Peninsula Council, were announced as the Best Rural Art for 2023 at the Australian Street Art Awards on Friday, 8 March.

The murals, located on Green Flat Road, were designed, and painted by Sam Brooks and Harley Hall, with the assistance of Mark Harding, Rachele Plazeriano and Gary Nowlan.

The artwork traces the history of Wool Bay from Narungga First Nations to European settlement and the town port through to modern day, including local flora and fauna as well as the town's iconic lime kiln.

"This incredible mural is a testament to the creativity and talent of our local artists, and it has truly transformed our community," Mayor Darren Braund said.

"The Wool Bay Water Tank Mural has captured the hearts and imaginations of our community, and I am thrilled to see it recognised on a national stage.

"We look forward to this award bringing more people to Yorke Peninsula to experience the Wool Bay mural and the entire Southern Yorke Peninsula Water Tower Mural Trail."

The Australian Street Art Awards, a tourism awards program for public art, encourages Australians to explore the world-class street and public art that is freely accessible all year round and found in every corner of the country.

"Artworks are unique and therefore clever communities promote their outdoor art, including welcome art, as a unique attraction that visitors can see in only one place," Awards Director Liz Rivers said.

The Wool Bay artwork is part of the Southern Yorke Peninsula

Water Tower Mural extension project, which also includes the recently completed giant mural at Minlacowie.

The project was made possible with funding from the Australian Government through the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program, and support from SA Water.

"We are thrilled the mural on our Wool Bay Water Tank and nearby storage shed has taken out top prize in the Best Rural Art category," SA Water General Manager of Customer, Community and Engagement David Coombe said.

"This masterpiece not only celebrates the history of the Yorke Peninsula, but also adds a splash of colour to our local infrastructure, which plays a pivotal role in supplying water to the local area.

"A special thank you to everyone who worked with us to make this extraordinary project a reality.

"The Wool Bay artwork is one of seven murals on our tanks across the Yorke Peninsula, and it's always exciting to witness the transformation of these active structures into vibrant canvases."

Artist Sam Brooks said he was grateful to hear his work had been recognised nationally.

"I put so much time and energy into listening to the community, and working alongside different cultures to make sure everyone is included and respected -- it's just great to see that people are recognising that," he said.

"The only thing that people see is the finished painting, not the years of planning, meetings, and design changes so this makes it all worth it.

"I hope this award shines a light on the incredible hard work of Yorke Peninsula Council and the awesome art trail they have built."

Garage Sale Trail report released

Yorke Peninsula Council residents turned their unwanted items into cash at the annual Garage Sale Trail last November.

More than \$10,000 was generated locally through the initiative.

Results of a recently released report by Garage Sale Trail and Taverner Research Group highlighted the outcomes of the waste reduction initiative made possible by Council.

Mayor Darren Braund said the research highlighted the local community's commitment to reduce waste.

"Programs like Garage Sale Trail are important in shifting perceptions of second-hand, and supporting the transition to a circular economy by getting more people reusing items rather than sending them to landfill," Mr Braund said.

Across the Council area more than 1200 people participated in the two big weekends of garage sales which aim to provide a fun way for residents to reduce waste, make some money and get to know their neighbours.

Nationally, the event saw a 44% increase in participation, with

419,705 Australians getting involved.

"More and more people are looking for ways to generate some extra cash or save money on everyday items," Garage Sale Trail General Manager Barbara Gill said.

"Buying and selling second-hand is one easy way we can all do this, whether it's hosting a garage sale or selling items online." Residents keen to snag a bargain, or turn their stash into cash, can now register their interest in the 2024 event, which takes place on 9-10 & 16-17 November, at www.garagesaletrail.com.au.

More reasons Y you should visit the YP Salt Lake Trail

Visitors to Pink Lake will soon be able to enjoy its beauty from a specially designed viewing platform.

The newly constructed platform, shaped as a Y to represent Yorke Peninsula and Yorketown, will allow visitors to safely walk out onto the lake.

The stem of the platform extends 75 metres into the lake, with each arm extending a further 25 metres.

“The Y shape will allow photographers to stand on one arm and take photos of people standing on the opposite arm,” Mayor Braund said.

“In winter, the water will lap at the edges of the Y, giving the impression of visitors standing on water.

“It curves towards the shoreline where a walking trail is currently being installed,” Mayor Braund said.

“While the lake surface may appear sturdy enough to stand

on, those who venture out into the lake and off the designated walkway will soon find themselves ankle or knee-deep in black mud – the walking trail and Y platforms are much better options.” Pink Lake is part of the Salt Lake Trail, a self-drive tour that showcases stunning pink, orange, blue, and white salt lakes. There are four different trails to choose from, depending on how much time you have to explore. Each tour is marked with different coloured signs and numbered to help you stay on track. Interpretative signs along the way provide information about the history of salt on Yorke Peninsula.

Changes to grading operations

Yorke Peninsula Council has changed its approach to road grading operations to deliver better outcomes and road maintenance works that last longer.

Council will limit unsealed road surface grading during the drier months and instead refocus its patrol grader resources toward specific works like road drainage, patch grading remediation of major road corrugations on curves with the help of supplementary plant or help accelerate road reconstruction works where water and other resources are more readily available.

Redirecting patrol grading in summer to either construction or other unsealed road activities will allow Council to finish construction works earlier to facilitate a diversion of more resources back to maintenance grading at the right time to provide better shape and compaction during the optimum grading months, May to September.

"In the drier weather, Council will cease road patrol grading which is comprised of dry grading material without moisture and compaction," Director of Assets and Infrastructure Andre Kompler said.

"The reason for this is the resulting work outcomes are largely ineffective and tend to last a very short time before the road is back to the previous rough condition.

"At worst, moving dry graded uncompacted material into road surface holes or leaving loose material on the road may affect road safety."

Mr Kompler said patrol graders would still be working on road-related projects during the drier months.

"Council is seeking best use of its construction plant and people to deliver longer-lasting road maintenance outcomes," Mr Kompler said.

"In the summer months, Council's patrol grading teams may be tasked to improve roadside drainage maintenance which facilitates less road damage during and after rainfall.

"They may also be paired with a watercart to focus on delivering longer-lasting patch grading maintenance repairs to areas of real safety concern.

"Some graders may be absorbed into Council's road renewal construction crews where they will help accelerate construction so that construction teams can be available to help the patrol grader teams in winter.

"In short, there will be more graders on Council roads during winter effecting best practise and this will result in better roads year-round."

Grant funding for coast protection projects

Yorke Peninsula Council has received more than \$55,000 in funding through the state government's 2023-24 Coast Protection Grants Program.

Council has received \$43,000 for foreshore modelling at Black Point and \$13,000 for planning and investigation work at Port Victoria and Port Vincent. Council will explore options for a new revetment design for the Port Victoria public toilets and a design for a seawall upgrade at Port Vincent foreshore.

The foreshore modelling project has been initiated by the Black Point Progress Association and will be the first step in developing a long-term strategy to understand and mitigate risks in the future

caused by coastal erosion to about 150 beach houses.

"Council uses its Strategic Coastal Risk Study Database to determine priority pathways forward, as it gives a holistic view of all competing coastal management issues in the area," Operations Manager Ian Yarrow said.

"Council is progressing through initiatives identified in the database and the projects at Port Vincent and Port Victoria are of a high priority.

"The designs and assessments will allow for construction at a later date subject to approved funding."

- CentrePay payment deductions via Centrelink
- Lump sum payments on specific dates
- Seniors' postponements

If you are having trouble paying your rates on time, we encourage you to contact Council's rates staff who are available to assist.

Please advise Council in writing (or via Council's Website) should you have a change of postal or email address. We require address information to ensure you receive your rate notice in sufficient time to make payment in full.

Draft Long Term Financial Plan out for consultation

Yorke Peninsula Council has released its Draft Long Term Financial Plan 2025-2034 for public consultation.

The Plan sets out the projected financial position for Council over the next ten years and details the financial strategies that will help achieve the outcomes of the Plan.

Each year Council reviews and updates its Plan using the latest financial data as well as incorporating all known future projects and variations.

"The objective of Plan is to ensure Council is financially sustainable in the short-to-medium term, and able to provide the ongoing current level of services and infrastructure," CEO Andrew Cameron said.

"Given the plan spans 10 years, the reader should keep in mind projections contained within the plan are less reliable as time progresses.

"To ensure responsiveness to changing conditions, Council conducts an annual review."

Mr Cameron encourages people to have their say about the LFTP which will be presented to Elected Members for endorsement at the Ordinary Meeting of Council in April.

"Council is proposing to allocate \$160.9m towards renewal and replacement of existing assets over the life of this Plan," Mr Cameron said.

"An additional \$14.3m over ten years is allocated for upgrades to assets and acquisition of new assets."

Mr Cameron said it should be noted that both renewal and new/upgrade allocations assume receipt of grant funding for several major projects.

"The anticipated timing of these major projects is often subject to circumstances outside of Council's ability to control due to the need for Council to secure an appropriate level of funding to facilitate these projects.

"Availability to funding provided to Council for specific projects is

not guaranteed and can when available also increase and decrease at the discretion of the funding body."

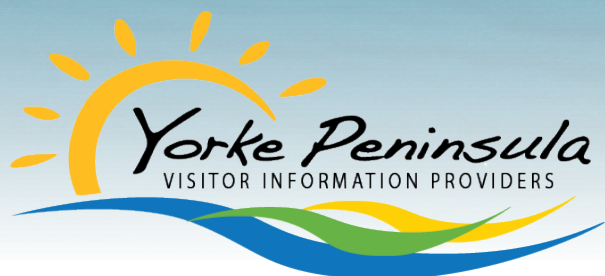
