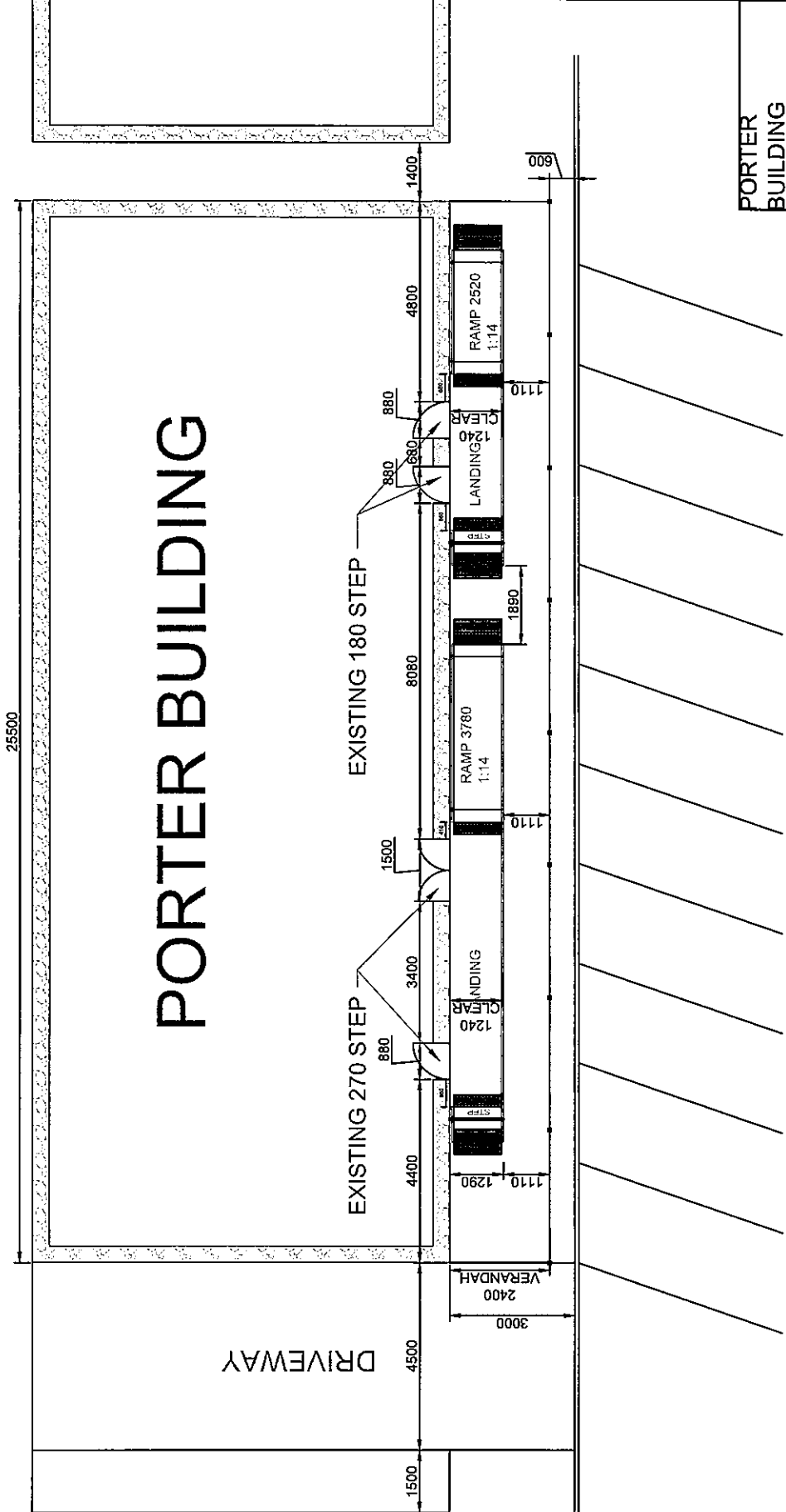

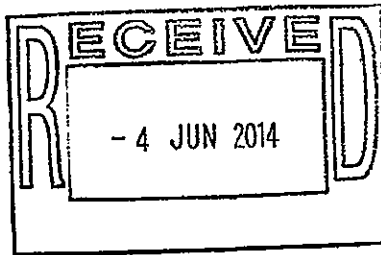

I am contacting you to thank you for the interest expressed by yourself on behalf of the Yorketown Progress Association in the patient access and egress of Yorketown Hospital.

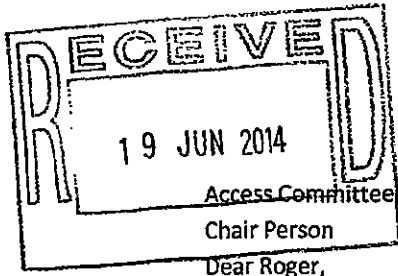

On behalf of the Yorketown School Community Library Board I would like to ask the Access Committee to help fund an access ramp. We are hoping your group could assist us help our elderly, mother's with prams and toddlers, and other patrons with a physical disability. Currently these library users have to either use a ramp which requires an extensive and extended route around the outside of the gym out in the elements, or struggle up two steps. We would like to modify the current library entrance route to cater for this disadvantaged group of patrons. The route we would like to modify would provide equitable access to the library for all of the community. It would allow patrons to access the library undercover, protecting them from the rain and hot summer sun. This is also a vastly shorter route than that which they must use at the moment.

Consultation with the Principal has clarified that Yorketown School is not in a financial position to assist with this as it does not affect students.

A quote has been obtained from Tapes for the work and Frank Endermann, the Senior Facilities Manager from Building Management Facilities Services has already provided a diagram of the proposed work to Roger Brooks. The quote is for \$8500 as at May2014. The Friends of the Library have agreed to fund \$1000 and we are looking for funds for the remainder.
