Burning Season from 15 February 2018 to 30 April 2018

a) <u>Hundreds of Para Wurlie. Coonarie. Carribie & Warrenben</u>

That a minimum of four (4) able bodied persons to control the fire must be present at the site of the fire from the time it is lit to the time it is completely extinguished.

Land situated within the Gum Flat. Kalkabury Council Wards & Hundred of Melville. Dalrymple & Moorowie

That a minimum of three (3) able bodied persons to control the fire must be present at the site of the fire from the time it is lit to the time it is completely extinguished. (Able bodied person is a person who is competently able to drive a vehicle and operate a pump and hose)

- b) That at least 1,000 litres of water connected to a working water pump and hoses must be kept at hand to extinguish the fire.
- c) The permit holder **must** validate the permit prior to lighting up by notifying an office of Council. The permit holder can notify Council the details of the burn online via Councils website from any time after 5pm on the day prior to the proposed burn. The permit holder can also notify Council by phoning/personally attending council on the day of the burn. Each proposed burn off location needs a separate validation. There is no need to contact a CFS Brigade/Officer.
- d) That the land immediately around the relevant land must be cleared of all flammable material to a distance of at least four metres. A four metre fuel break must be put in place surrounding any trees within the proposed burn off.
- e) That the fire must be lit from the leeward side of the relevant land to establish a protective break, and then may be lit from the windward side of the land.
- f) That the holder of the permit must, no more than seven days, and no less than two hours, before the fire is lit, give notice of their intention to light the fire-
 - to any person who owns, occupies or is in charge of land adjoining, including opposite roadways, the land holding where the relevant land is situated, and who resides within 8 kilometres of the relevant land or if it is not reasonably practicable to give such notice, to the person in charge of the nearest police station; and
 - ii) if the relevant land is within two kilometres of a government reserve to the person in charge of the reserve.
- g) Burning off is only permitted between the hours of 9.00am-9.00pm Monday to Friday. No burning is permitted on Saturdays, Sundays and Public Holidays.
- h) If the fire escapes or appears to be out of control, immediately phone 000 for assistance.

NOTE: Before lighting, current and predicted weather conditions must be seriously considered as well as being mindful of wind direction on the day of the burn and the following day so as not to create a smoke hazard to road users or nuisance to townships.

Section 81 (13) of the Fire and Emergency Services Act 2005

"The fact that the holder of a permit has complied with the conditions of the permit does not itself relieve the holder from liability for any loss or damage caused by a fire lit under the authority of a permit."

FAILING TO COMPLY WITH ANY PERMIT CONDITION MAY RESULT IN THE PERMIT BEING REVOKED AND A \$315 EXPLATION NOTICE BEING ISSUED.
