Introducing the new Integrated Waste, Recycling and Garden Waste Collection Service

- ☐ District Council of Yorke Peninsula has recently adopted a new waste management strategy to comply with the State Government's Zero Waste Policy.
- ☐ The initiative provides an incentive for SA Councils to upgrade or introduce kerbside recycling systems, to minimise waste disposal in landfills and increase the recovery of recyclables to 75% by 2010.
- ☐ The new waste, recycling and garden organics waste collection service is easy, convenient and for many residents, will reduce the hassle of taking household waste to the landfill.

Please note: rural residents do not receive a garden organics waste collection service.

☐ Businesses may receive a maximum of three waste bins and three recycling bins; charges will apply.

WASTE BIN

District Council of Yorke Peninsula will provide you with a new 140L waste bin, which will replace your old waste bin. Waste will be collected weekly.

Your new waste bin will be smaller than your old bin, but you won't need the extra space because only waste, not recyclables, will go in here.

RECYCLING BIN

District Council of Yorke Peninsula is implementing a fortnightly recycling collection service to all residents. Residents will receive a new 240L recycling bin.

Place paper, cardboard, glass jars and bottles, all plastics that hold their shape, metal cans and tins into this bin for recycling.

GARDEN ORGANICS WASTE BIN

A monthly garden organics waste collection service will be introduced to all townships listed.

Your previous 240L waste bin will now become your garden organics waste bin.

This bin is for leaves, bark, twigs and small branches, prunings and lawn clippings.

GARDEN ORGANICS WASTE BIN

WHEN WILL I RECEIVE MY NEW BINS?

In September, 2008.

WHEN DO I START USING MY NEW BINS?

The week commencing **13th October** 2008. Please do not use your new bins before this date. You will receive a calendar with your new bins, to provide more details of your collection day.

WHAT HAPPENS TO MY OLD BIN?

This will become your garden waste bin.

HOW DO I GET MORE INFORMATION?

An information booklet will be provided with your new bins to guide you in the use of the new bins and to inform you of what items go into each bin.

WHAT OTHER CHANGES WILL TAKE PLACE?

The opening of three new Transfer Stations, at CYP, Ramsay and Warooka is planned for October 2008. These will provide the same services as the former landfill sites, however the material will be transferred to appropriate sites in Adelaide. The closure of all landfill sites will occur when the Transfer Stations open.

HOW DOES THIS AFFECT MY RATES?

These changes do not come without a cost. To pay for the new service a separate service charge is to be charged by Council.

In October, when the new service starts, those ratepayers who are provided with the new service will receive a Rates Notice which will include a Waste and Recycling service charge (this charge is not included in the Rates Notice received in August).

The three bin service charge for the nine months of 2008/2009 will be approximately \$145 and \$130 for the two bin service.

MY LOCATION IS NOT ON THE LIST.

Rural areas will receive a waste and recycling service only. Details will be sent to those residents.
