

Why are some items NOT recyclable?

- Some items are made from a variety of materials that can not be separated (chocolate and chip packets often have a plastic outer and an aluminium inner).
- Pyrex, window glass and mirrors have a different melting point to ordinary glass.
- Videotapes, strapping, string and rope can get caught in machinery, causing breakdown.
- Broken glass, nappies, dirty pot plant containers can be an occupational health and safety issue.

Waste

- Chip packets, lolly and chocolate wrappers.
- Nappies, fabric, linen, clothing, cleaning cloths and sponges.
- Broken crockery, cutlery.
- Broken glass, mirrors, pyrex, window glass.
- String, rope, plastic strapping, wire, netting.
- Video and audio tapes, CDs, memory cards.
- Plastic bags, polystyrene, foam, cling wrap.
- Alkaline batteries (AA, AAA, video, etc.).



- Mobile phone batteries can be taken to any Telstra or Optus store where they are recycled.
- Car and truck batteries can be taken to a Council Transfer Station.
